3. Update on Wellness – Linda Wright, Director of Food Services at SISD

- March 13 TEA will go back to remove some restrictions that can be sold in schools... specifically on cola drinks
- TEA is trying to match USDE restrictions and remove some restrictions that TEA had that were different from USDE
- TEA will be looking at fundraisers, time & place restrictions
- Schools have 5 years to get everything in compliance with no fines
- Linda Wright will keep the council updated as new things arise

4. Program – Cary Moring, SISD Safety Coordinator

- Lexan glass (bullet proof) has been installed in all classroom doors
- Panic Buttons (over 400 district wide) have been purchased for classrooms & various areas in campuses
- Police respond to location immediately
- Notifications goes to police, sheriff, county coordinator
- There are 199 security cameras installed in campuses throughout the district
- All buildings have one secure entrance; enter and go into the office area immediately
- Key fobs allow entrance without keys for administrators and various campus personnel (police have these for quick entry)
- Lockdown drill has been conducted district wide
- School safety audit is done every 3 years
- Keep in Track system is at every campus office; visitors must leave driver license (which are scanned) and receive a visitor badge to enter the campus; driver license are picked up when visitors leave the campus
- Every campus has a Crisis Response Plan

- Revising District Safety Plan
- Tornado plan revised after the Oklahoma Tornado. Maps are in buildings as to where to go for shelter; all First Responders have copies of maps of each campus.
- H₂S poisonous gas...Monitors are on each school bus to monitor the amount of H₂S. Drill was held with city in February for all entities involved in a H₂S leak. Talked through all scenarios.
- Door numbers have been placed at each campus on all exterior doors. From safety audit, we needed to have these in place so responders can come to the correct area when called in for emergency.
- Custodial Audits last summer...checked to make sure no flammable items stored in custodian closets and no blocked ways to electrical boxes.
- There are 24 AEDs throughout the district. Has step-by-step directions on how to use incase of heart attack.
- Monthly safety meeting conducted with custodians/maintenance staff
- Cameras are on each school bus.
- NOAA weather radio on each campus to monitor the weather
- Weather Bug system installed near the SISD Fieldhouse; if lightning storms come within 10 miles, it will sound for everyone to move inside. Coaches/admin plus various staff will get alert on cell phones to clear outside area and when to resume activities
- Various drills are conducted throughout the district at each campus for safety (i.e. bus evacuation, fire, tornado, etc.)
